SIDEWALK UPDATE

The Town has been awarded a grant for \$348,000.00 through the

Alabama Department of Transportation's Alternative Transportation Program for the installation of sidewalks. These will run along the south side of Gates Avenue, the west side of Old Marlow Road, the south side of School Street and the east side of Magnolia Avenue. Sidewalks will improve walkability, safety and will assist in the implementation of the Comprehensive Plan.

TOWN WIDE BULKY WASTE MONTHLY CLEAN SWEEP

Baldwin County Solid Waste will conduct the next monthly bulky waste pickup for residents within Town Limits on **October 26**th, **2023**. Clean Sweeps are scheduled for the 4th Thursday of every month. This pickup will be replacing the once per month resident scheduled pickup. Any additional pick up requests will be subject to a fee. Please have your bulky items placed in the Right-of-Way by 6am on the day of pick up.

REQUIREMENTS:

Bulky Waste

Yes - Furniture, Appliances, Carpet, Auto Tires (Only 4 tires per pickup, no larger than 20" in diameter)

White Goods

Yes - Refrigerator, Range, Water Heater, Air Conditioner, Exercise Equipment and Other Large Appliances Swing Sets (must be brown down), NO - Fence Wire

Light Construction

Yes - Small Home Self-Repairs, DIY Projects

Yard Waste

Yes - Grass Clippings, Leaves (must be bagged), Twigs, Etc. NO - Tree Trunks or Limbs over 6" in diameter
