- Wedge sliding glass door so they don't lift off track

When evacuating, leave 24 hours to 36 hours before gale force winds are expected to hit.



RIGHT-OF-WAY

The Right-of-Way is an area on, below, or above a public roadway, highway,



street, sidewalk, etc. in which a municipality has an interest. This diagram shows that a property line does not always extend to the street. The space between the property line and the road is the right-of-way. That area can be used for sidewalks, utilities, and other public interests. It does need to be maintained to ensure safety and access to the right-of-way. Nothing should be built or installed in this area. In an effort to ensure an accessible right-of-way, property owners should keep this area free of debris. This includes plants or trees that may need to be trimmed to ensure access.

The Comprehensive Plan is an official public document that provides the framework for long-range planning and decision-making in a community. The Plan serves as a guide to manage the Town's growth and development through a time period of twenty years. However, the Plan should be updated every five to ten years, or as needed, to properly align with the growth and changes that are occurring over time.

The adopted Comprehensive Plan serves as the statutory basis for many of the Town's land use regulations and other regulatory and policy tools such as subdivision regulations and zoning codes, as well as the application of zoning districts, as zoning must be consistent with a comprehensive plan per Code of Alabama, 11-52-72.

WHAT DOES THE COMPREHENSIVE PLAN ACCOMPLISH?

- Express a community's vision of itself the community it would like to become.
- Establish an organized public process to identify community values and goals
- Examine community needs and identifies solutions
- Create a framework for decision-making regarding the future of the city and guides the investment of public funds and
- Provide a policy framework to ensure consistency with other planning efforts, land use decisions, and capital improvement projects
- Offer a budgeting tool by targeting the need and timing for investment of tax dollars in public facilities and
- Ensure consistency and compatibility with the plans of nearby cities and the county
- Indicate what is needed to support planned growth, striking a balance between the land use and its capital improvement needs
- Offer a tool to coordinate the provision of city programs and services
- Expand eligibility for grants and other funding sources needed to bring projects to fruition
