- Whereas,** trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires and countless other wood products, and
- Whereas,** trees in our town increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, and
- Whereas,** trees, wherever they are planted, are a source of joy and spiritual renewal, and
- Whereas,** the Town of Magnolia Springs desires to continue its tree-planting practices


NOW, THEREFORE, I Charles S. Houser, Mayor of the Town of Magnolia Springs, do hereby proclaim **February 21, 2009** as




